Position Summary

As part of a multi-disciplinary team, the Family Coach's primary responsibility is to provide direct services to families in their home. While effectively engaging clients and focusing on growth, development and positive change, Family Coaches use evidence based model of practices to engage vulnerable families in positive change. These include following ethical guidelines which respect the client's uniqueness and right to self-determination while keeping in mind a child's right to be protected.

The main job functions of the position are providing one to one parent coaching with practical parenting needs; to strengthen the family's connections to their community and empowering caregivers to thrive in unique circumstances.

The ability to work creatively and adaptively with children and parents together is required. A background in foster parenting, high conflict family situations, trauma, grief and loss, attachment, neuroscience, play based approaches and resiliency are a definite asset. Additional on-going training is available to the successful candidate.

Family Coaches are required to manage active caseloads and be willing to see clients in their home. Caseload composition varies according to the needs of the community, funder requests and needs of the agency. Family Coaches are responsible for case management cases including assessment, intervention and closure as well as documentation of the process and collection of data for outcomes.

Family Coaches are required to participate in initial and on-going training in order to deliver service according to best practice and ethical guidelines, to attend supervision regularly and to work

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holistically and collaboratively with all services involved. Family Coaches ensure that services are delivered according to policy and procedure guidelines and performance standards. Family Coaches must be available to deliver service during evenings and weekends when needed and be flexible and creative in meeting client's needs.

Qualifications & Experience

- Para Professional status, preferably, not limited to advanced Foster Parenting experience
- Minimum of 5 years of experience working with young children (ages from birth to 3) and families are required.
