## Opportunity for Registered Provisional Psychologists (CAP)

### ABOUT THE INTERNSHIP

**Internship Length:** 12 – 15 months

**Hours Requirement:** 37.5 hours per week

**Monthly Stipend:** \$2,500

As part of Carya's Counselling Services team, a **Registered Provisional Psychologist** receives support and guidance to develop their expertise, with the aim of becoming a skilled mental health service provider. They also contribute to Carya's mission of promoting ethical mental health practices. Short-term counseling is provided in 8-10 sessions for individuals, dyads, triads, and families, as well as through group programs.

### WHO YOU ARE

- You are compassionate and curious, motivated to support people across the lifespan with thoughtful, trauma-informed care that builds resilience and confidence.
- You value collaboration and connection, working closely with teams, partners, and communities to support holistic and coordinated care.
- You are reflective and growth-oriented, embracing supervision, feedback, and ongoing learning to continually strengthen your clinical practice.

### WHAT YOU WILL DO

#### Counselling & Participant Support

- Provide client-centered counselling services to individuals of all ages, including children, families, and older adults.
- Conduct needs assessments, develop service goals, and connect participants to appropriate community resources.
- Apply trauma-informed, strengths-based approaches that empower clients and promote resilience.

#### Collaboration, Program Delivery & Community Engagement

- Work collaboratively with internal teams, supervisors, and partner agencies to support coordinated care and case management activities.
- Facilitate groups, workshops, and webinars that support participant learning and connection.
- Contribute to community referrals, system navigation, and initiatives that strengthen service delivery.

#### Documentation, Supervision & Professional Practice

- Maintain accurate clinical documentation and meet reporting requirements in accordance with professional and agency standards.
- Participate in regular supervision, team meetings, and consultation to support quality practice and continuous learning.



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- Work a 37.5-hour week including two evening shifts (appointments concluding by 8:00 PM) and submit monthly invoices to support timely stipend processing.

## WHAT YOU BRING

- **Master's degree in clinical or counselling psychology is required.**
- **Completion of AFWI Brain Story is required.**
- Familiarity with family systems and attachment theory, with a strong interest in advancing skills in working with families or older adults.
- Basic knowledge of Trauma-Informed Therapy.
- Training and experience in treatment modalities such as CBT, attachment-based therapy, family systems therapy, narrative therapy, sand tray therapy, and trauma-focused approaches are assets.
- Strong attention to detail, with the ability to act with discretion and maintain confidentiality.
- A positive attitude and a commitment to delivering high-quality services are essential.
- Exceptional teamwork and collaboration skills.
- Excellent oral and written communication skills; proficiency in additional languages is an asset.
- A posture of cultural humility when working with diverse populations; experience with Indigenous and/or immigrant families is an asset.
- Proficiency in Microsoft 365, including SharePoint, Word, Teams, and Outlook.
- Familiarity with, or proficiency in, case management software such as Jane.
- Strong organizational skills with the ability to manage and prioritize emails and calendars effectively.
